IMPACT OFHOME VISITING

The Maternal, Infant, & Early Childhood Home Visiting program is part of the Louisiana Department of Health, Bureau of Family Health. The program uses two evidence-based models to provide in-home support to families: Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) and Parents As Teachers (PAT).

By meeting families where they are, home visiting programs have demonstrated short and long-term impacts on the health, safety, and school-readiness of children; maternal health; and family stability and financial security.

Home visitors are able to meet with families in their homes and provide culturally competent, individualized needs assessments and services.

Pregnant participants are more likely to access prenatal care and carry their babies to term.

Home visiting promotes caregiving practices like breastfeeding, healthy sleep practices nutrition, positive parent-child interactions, and responsive caregiving which have been associated with positive long-term outcomes related to cognitive development and child health.
